NEW VOLUNTEER ORIENTATION

To Become a UW-Extension Volunteer...

Adults who would like to volunteer with UW-Extension 4-H Youth Development or other programs must complete a number of steps.

- 1. Complete 4-H online enrollment form;
- 2. New volunteers attend a Volunteer in Preparation training which will
 - o provide an overview of UW-Extension
 - o clarify your role as a UW-Extension volunteer
 - share the policy on mandatory reporting of child abuse and neglect and discuss how it affects your role as a volunteer
 - discuss and deepen your understanding of 4-H youth development and how we/you teach young people
 - o provide you with tools to be a successful volunteer
- 3. Annually sign a volunteer behavior expectation and assumption of risk form
- 4. New volunteers complete the on-line UW-Extension volunteer mandated reporter training. This training is accessed through the 4HOnline enrollment system.
- 5. Pass a criminal background check. This is done at the initial time of volunteering as well as every four years.

What opportunities exist?

- Citizenship Washington Focus in Washington, D.C. (June-July);
- National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, Georgia (late November);
- Space Camp in Huntsville, Alabama (late April);
- American Spirit Experience East (Early June or July);
- Wisconsin 4-H & Youth Conference (Late June);
- International immersion programs in Costa Rica, Japan, Finland, South Korea (4 weeks, summer 2019);

Who can apply?

- Applicants must be at least 21 years old (25 for some experiences) at time of program.
- Applicants must have completed the Wisconsin 4-H VIP Training and currently be registered as 4-H leaders.

4-H ENROLLMENT

Last call for returning members to enroll! December 31, 2018, is the cutoff to be eligible to participate in the 2019 county fair. So far only half of our existing members have re-enrolled!

4HOnline is ready to accept new and re-enrollments for the 2018-2019 enrollment year: https://wi.4honline.com. The Calumet County 4-H Youth Development website (http://calumet.uwex.edu/4-h-youth-development/) has information to assist you with the re-enrollment process. A few important things that you need to know are:

<u>Timelines</u>: Re-enrollments are requested by November 1. The final deadline for re-enrollment, in order to be eligible to show at the 2019 Calumet County Fair, is December 31. New enrollments are accepted at any time during the year. The deadline for new enrollees, in order to be eligible to show at the 2019 Calumet County Fair, is April 1.

<u>Forgotten Password</u>: If a family forgot their family's 4HOnline password, use the Forgot Password feature on the login page and a temporary password will be emailed.

<u>Dues</u>: 4-H clubs may choose to adopt a policy that dues need to be paid before the club's Enrollment Manager will approve 4HOnline enrollments. Please be aware of your club's policy regarding this matter, and pay your dues promptly!

<u>4-H Project Guide 2019</u> is also available on our Calumet County 4-H Youth Development website. Re-enrollment instructions and Entering as a New Family instructions will include step-by-step enrollment instructions.

Calumet County will camp with Outagamie County. Applications are being accepted for youth staff and adult volunteer positions. Applications are available on our webpage under "Things to do in 4-H". http://calumet.uwex.edu/4-h-youth-development/.

Applications for youth and adult staff are due December 31. Interviews in Calumet County are Thursday, January 17, from 6:00-8:00 pm at the Courthouse. For those who cannot make this date, there will also be interviews at the Outagamie County UW-Extension office on Wednesday, January 9. All applicants must attend an interview.

Positions available include Junior Directors, Outpost Counselors, Base Camp Counselors, Base Camp Junior Counselors, Program (crafts, recreation, nature, and evening program) staff. Youth staff must be at least 14 years old.

Adult volunteers are also needed. Positions include bus coordinator, first aid coordinator, first aid assistant, dining hall supervisor, photographer, outpost leader. Position descriptions for each of these duties is available in the camp staff application packet from the 4-H Office.

PINEWOOD DERBY IS RETURNING TO CALUMET COUNTY 4-H!

A popular event for our 4-H program last year is returning and it is open to **all** 4-H members (Cloverbuds thru 13th grade), as well as adults!

What is a pinewood derby? It is a racing event where you build your own car from kits containing a block of pine, plastic wheels, and metal axles. The Leaders Council will purchase the kits for our members to participate! If an adult would like to compete as well, they would need to purchase their own kit, approx. \$3-4 each.



Members will receive a block of wood made of pine, four plastic wheels, and four nails. The finished car must use all nine pieces, must not exceed a certain weight, must not exceed a certain width and length, and must fit on the track used.

Blocks can be whittled with a hand knife, bandsaw, or Dremel carving tool for major shaping. Decals can be bought to decorate your car, or you are encouraged to use your imagination to paint and decorate the way you'd like!

A kickoff event takes place on Saturday, January 5, at 2:00 pm in the lower level of the Courthouse. At this meeting you will receive the rules as well as the kit to start construction of your car. On February 23, we will host a practice day to come and test your car on the track so improvements can be made. The final event will take place on Sunday, March 3. Multiple awards per division will be awarded, including fastest car, most fuel efficient car, and people's choice best decorated car!

4-H DAIRY BOWL

Looking for an opportunity to test and expand your knowledge of dairy animals and related dairy subjects? If this is something you might want to learn more about, please contact Jennifer Meyer at ienmeyer2@gmail.com. We will give study materials to those interested and begin regular practice soon.

Competition in 4-H Dairy Bowl encourages a 4-H member to develop a more complete knowledge of dairy animals and related subjects. This contest provides an educational dairy program for all dairy project members, including those who may not own a dairy project animal, and provides a way to develop alertness and self-confidence. Members do not need to be in the dairy project to participate.

Dairy Bowl is a "quiz bowl" competition where all questions deal with dairy topics. Teams of four members compete with each other in giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. Teams receive points for correct answers and may lose points for incorrect answers. The team with the highest final score is the winner.

The contest is organized on a double elimination basis with winning teams advancing into further rounds until a champion team emerges. The state competition is typically held in Madison, in January or February.
