One of the most important deadlines you will see this month takes place July 31, when your county fair entries are due. I hope your projects are coming along nicely and offer these simple reminders:

- Please watch the category you are entering your projects in very closely, as well as any special rules (such as poster size, animal age, judging date).
- Be sure your 4-H member is entering in the Junior Class, not the Open Class (this area is for adults).
- If you are entering a class by school grade, like showmanship, you use the grade just completed, not the new grade starting in fall.
- Members just completing grades K5-2 enter cloverbud projects.

On Wednesday, August 14, from 5:30-7:00 we will host a 4-H Opportunity Fair at the Fairgrounds. This is a great chance to come and learn about different project areas, educational travel experiences, and volunteer opportunities available through 4-H. The general public is also invited to attend, so your club is encouraged to create a tri-fold display to help recruit new members. We have gained many new families from this event! Display boards are available for free from the office if any club or project area would like to make one!

equipment or equipment parts. Topics include specialized machinery for livestock, toxic environments, agricultural chemicals, blasting, fertilizer, and the youth certificate program.





Out-of-County Meetings

If you have market animal education meeting slips from out-of-county meetings you've attended, please return them to the UWEX Office promptly after the meeting takes place. Forms must be turned in no later than pen set up at the fair (August 20).

Swine Ear Tags

A reminder to return any unused ear tags to the Extension office or to a market animal committee member or risk being charged for the unused tags.

Open Class Hogs

If you are bringing **open class hogs** to the fair, please have your processing appointments booked **before** you come to the fair.

Terminal Swine Show

Remember, Calumet County has a terminal swine show, so no pigs can go back home at the end of the fair due to the PRSS prevention protocol. Lightweight pigs are able to return home if they go there directly from weigh-in night. (If they stay on the grounds for the show, they cannot go home.)

DAIRY ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM GUIDELINES

In order to encourage youth to stay involved with dairy projects, a group of dairy businesses and lenders will provide financial incentives for all dairy project members who qualify.

To qualify for dairy enhancement, participants must

- 1) Complete the Dairy Enhancement Application Form and turn it in by the **July 31 deadline**
- 2) Enter and show in one of the four showmanship classes at the Calumet County Fair
- 3) For youth in grades 3 and above (grade determined as of January of current year)
 - a. Gold level participate in eight dairy educational activities
 - b. Silver level participate in five dairy educational activities
 - c. Bronze level participate in three dairy educational activities
- 4) For youth in grades 7 and over, write an essay (150 word minimum) on what I learned by participating in the Dairy Enhancement Program.

The Calumet County Dairy Enhancement Committee, consisting of Gina Lemke, Don Schmidt, Shay Ott, and Jeff Brantmeier, will review the application forms to determine eligibility, and their decision will be final.

If you don't have access to the internet, a copy of the fairbook is available for viewing at the 4-H Office and all main 4-H club leaders have also received a printed copy of the Junior Class Fairbook.

The Fair Board has increased the exhibitor fees to \$5.00 for Junior Class Exhibitors and \$10.00 for Open Class Exhibitors. Pen and stall fees at the Calumet County Fair has also increased: Rabbit and poultry cage fees are \$1.00 each; and stall/pen fees for all other animals will be \$3.00 each.

4-H BOOTHS

4-H clubs making their plans for the 2019 4-H booth should keep in mind that the 4-H theme for this year is "4-H Helps You Dress for Success."

The fair booth size is 5' wide by 4' deep by 8' high. Some have an electrical outlet. Remember: each club wishing to reserve a booth must submit a fair entry by the July 31 deadline.

Important: No staples will be allowed.

PLEASE REMEMBER: 4-H booths are a youth entry, so ONLY 4-H members, not parents or leaders, should be putting the booth in place. We ask for all clubs' cooperation on this guideline, to make it a youth-centered learning experience.

Please see the fairbook (Department 032) for a list of criteria that the booth will be evaluated on.

Booths may be put up on Tuesday, August 27, or Wednesday, August 28, from 10:00 am – 8:00 pm.

COUNTY FAIR ENTRY DEADLINE - JULY 31

Have you decided what you are entering in the county fair yet? Here are a few suggestions of what to consider when selecting exhibits to enter.

Enter exhibits only in Junior Class Departments that reflect the 4-H projects you are enrolled in this year. 4-H is an educational program designed to help youth learn and master new skills in various project areas. The county fair is the culminating event of the year, like a science or art fair at school. Here, the youth bring exhibits that demonstrate all they have learned and worked on throughout the year.

Most junior class departments match up closely with the 4-H project area titles. However, there are a few departments that cluster several project areas together, including...

<u>Natural Sciences</u> – includes projects such as Exploring Your Environment, Wildflowers, Adventure activities, the Shooting Sport projects, Recycling, Wisconsin Wildlife, and Fishing.

Mechanical Sciences – includes projects such as Small Engines, Bicycle, Aerospace, Scale Models, and Robotics.

Family and Child Development – includes Intergenerational, Personal Finance, and Entrepreneurship.

Youth should select exhibits that they feel show the best of their project work. It isn't our goal to enter everything we've done through the year, but rather to help the youth to learn to reflect and evaluate what exhibits are most meaningful to them and best show their efforts. Parents and leaders may offer valuable guidance to youth in this process, but ultimately, it is the youth's decision.

Read the Fair rules carefully! Everyone should read the "General Rules & Regulations," as well as the rules in each of the Departments that they are entering. If you are exhibiting animals, please also make sure to read the "WI County, District & State Fairs 2019 Animal Health Rules & Regulations."

Double-check your entry form. Please make sure that you are using the 2019 Junior Fair Book at http://calumetcountyfair.com/fair handbook.html, as some of the codes and numbers have changed since 2018. Entries not recorded correctly will make you ineligible for fair premiums. Feel free to ask your project leader to help you check your entries.

Keep a copy of your entry form for your own reference. This will make it easier to prepare for the fair and prevent unwelcome surprises on Advance Judging Day, Saturday, August 24.

Submit the fair entry form, with entry fees either online or to Clara Hedrich, Fair Secretary, by the July 31 deadline. Clara's address is on the "All Classes Entry Form." Early submissions are preferred! You can mail in this entry form and fees, or drop them off at Clara's rural Chilton home. NO entry forms will be accepted at the UW-Extension Office.

Animal Exhibitors – Be sure to record Animal Showmanship on your Entry Form and list your premise ID number.

Club Fair Booth, Reporter's Scrapbook, Banner, and Planter entries are part of Department 032 – Youth Group Entries and must be listed on your club's entry blank if entering.

Finally, if you are an experienced 4-H family, please take a moment to check in with the new families in your club. The county fair entering and exhibiting process can be a bit confusing and overwhelming at first, so we each need to make sure we are doing what we can to make this an awesome experience for everyone. If you have questions on your fair entries, don't hesitate to contact the 4-H Office.

Remember that adults can exhibit items too! Projects would be exhibited in the Open Class Departments.

Wishing you all a wonderful summer, as we busily prepare for another great Calumet County Fair!
