THINGS TO KNOW BEFORE COMING TO ADVANCED JUDGING DAY – AUGUST $\mathbf{27}^{\text{TH}}$

Hopefully you kept a copy or list of the items you listed on your Fair Entry Form. Use this list to help you remember what items you planned to bring.

Read the Junior Class Fairbook exhibiting guidelines for each department that you are exhibiting in, for information on the date and time of judging, exhibit size requirements, and possible changes to hanger and displaying requirements.

Judging will run from **9:00am – 2:00pm**, with staggered half hour lunch breaks for judges. You can come at any time during the day, but know that the process will take time (30 minutes to 3 hours, depending on the number of exhibits).

We strongly encourage families to make sure they arrive by 1:00pm, as judging ends at 2:00pm. **Exhibitors must be in their** <u>final line</u> by 2:00pm. Late exhibits will not be judged face-to-face and may be marked down one or more placings.

POULTRY PROJECT

Shawn will be pullorum testing birds on August 14th from 8am-Noon at N8444 Rosner Rd, Hilbert, WI 54129. Everyone who test that day will need a premise ID code with them. A market poultry meeting will be after testing, starting at 12:00 noon.

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) announces that the statewide order prohibiting movement of poultry to all live events has been lifted. The order had been in effect since May to prevent the spread of highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) in Wisconsin.

While poultry is now permitted at live events, DATCP continues to encourage strong biosecurity practices including cleaning and disinfecting, restricting access by visitors and wild birds, and keeping separate shoes and clothes to wear around flocks. Since March, 22 domestic flocks in 14 Wisconsin counties have been confirmed with the virus, and states continue to identify new infections at backyard and commercial farms.

Poultry owners should continue monitoring their birds for increased mortality or signs of illness. Reports can be submitted to DATCP at (608) 224-4872 (business hours) or (800) 943-0003 (after hours and weekends).

DATCP also reminds poultry owners to <u>register their premises</u>. State law requires that all livestock owners register where their animals are kept, and registration helps animal health officials communicate with flock owners during disease outbreaks.
