## Nominate an Outstanding Calumet County 4-H Volunteer

Nominations are being accepted for the following four awards:

- Friend of 4-H Award given each year to a business or an individual (NOT a 4-H leader) that has been a strong supporter of the 4-H program.
- Special Leadership Award Two to three awards are given each year to 4-H volunteers who have made significant contributions to the 4-H program at a club or county level over the course of their 4-H career.
- 4-H Volunteer of the Year One award is given per year to a 4-H volunteer who has made significant contributions of time and effort to the 4-H program during the recent year(s). This award is for individuals with less than 10 years of service at the local, county, district, or state level.
- Lifetime Volunteer of the Year One award is given per year to a 4-H volunteer who has made significant contributions of time and effort to the 4 -H program during their volunteer career. This award is for individuals with 10 or more years of service at the local, county, district, or state level.

If you do not know if a volunteer has more than 10 years or less than 10 years of service, please nominate them for both awards and we will place them in the correct category.

# **Calumet County 4-H Attendance Policy**

Members are required to attend a minimum of 1/3 of their club's annual meetings

- Grade 13 members (college/technical school) are exempt from attendance requirement, but are encouraged to attend as many club meetings as possible. Younger members gain from older youth interaction and positive role modeling.
- Members can be excused from 50 percent of their club's total number of meetings. Excused meetings do not count towards the attendance requirement.
  - Members need to be excused prior to the club meeting.
  - Each club should decide how and who to call for excused absences.
  - Approved excused absences include: church related activity, school functions, work, illness, family emergencies, other scheduled 4-H activities.
- Clubs have the authority to set higher attendance requirements than this stated county policy. (Check with your club leader for club rules and guidelines.)
- Youth who do not meet attendance requirements:
  - Will not be able to show at the county fair as a 4-H exhibitor

Main leaders will be expected to notify the 4-H Office about those members not meeting the attendance requirement. By June

- 1, the 4-H office will send a list of the enrolled members to the Main Leader of each club with a form to complete and return by August 1.
- Will not be eligible for honor trips and awards the following year.

Example: If a club holds 12 meetings in the year, the minimum requirement for a member is:

- 1. Must attend 4 meetings
- 2. Be excused from 6 meetings
- 3. Leaving 2 that would be unaccounted for

# Important Information for the 2022-2023 4-H HORSE Project

I have resigned as the Lead HORSE/HORSELESS HORSE Project Leader. I have enjoyed being the Project Leader, and will miss being involved with the youth.

The position of Project Leader is open for anyone willing to take on the challenge of educating youth about horses and how much fun they are. Please contact Carlea Liermann to find out more about this opportunity. Carlea is the 4-H Program Coordinator for Calumet County. She can be reached at <u>carlea.liermann@wisc.edu</u>.

The HORSE Project is a chartered project. Some of the requirements are submitting annual financial statements, submitting the annual charter paperwork, and submitting an annual budge request. If the Charter is not maintained, the HORSE project loses its independence and ability to manage its own funds. At this time, there are funds available in the 2021-2022 (hopefully to be rolled into the 2022-2023) budget for the HORSE project, as well as funds in the project checking account. Additional tasks involve helping with the Hippology stations during pre-fair judging and assisting in submitting paperwork for youth to participate in the State Expo event.

There are two parts to the HORSE Project, the main project area and the HORSELESS HORSE area. A common assumption is that if you do not have access to a horse or pony, you must be a member of the HORSELESS HORSE area. This is incorrect. HORSELESS HORSE is very specific in its objective, to allow a youth to share a horse with a non-family member 4-H youth or leader who has a horse. These youth are eligible to show in the HORSELESS HORSE classes.

Besides the local county fair, there are multiple opportunities available at the State and Regional levels, including: Speech and Demonstration competitions, Veterinary Science events, Hippology, Horse Bowl, Area Animal Science Days, State Hunt and Dressage Show, State Gymkhana, State Model Horse Show, State Expo Educational evens, and, by qualification, State Expo Horse Show.

I have several years of material - some photos from State that were not picked up as well as scrapbook pages from several years ago. In addition, there are multiple copies and editions of the 4-H handbooks (not just horses, I have cats and calves, and other things). I will be disposing of these items in January 2023 if they have not been claimed. I would prefer to give these leaders manuals and handbooks to 4-H leaders & youth. It's normal for youth to have questions or be unsure about things. Give your youth the information you can to help them plan, organize, make wise decisions, and problem solve. It will encourage your child to think critically and use this knowledge throughout life.

> My heart to greater loyalty Success is awesome. Some failure is inevitable. Both help youth develop strong personal values and a positive self-concept. Encourage and support all youth, especially your own, to have empathy and concern for others. Show your child by example how to cooperate and communicate with those around them.

# My hands to larger service

When you help your family's club, you model volunteerism, community service, and inclusiveness to your youth. If you don't have the time to be a volunteer, you can help in many equally important ways. If you do want to learn more about volunteering, contact the Extension Office!
