### Meal Planning Day & Foods Review

Back by popular demand, Meal Planning Day will be held Saturday, June 10, at Chilton High School in conjunction with Foods Review and a newly incorporated Cupcake War!

The purpose of Meal Planning Day and Foods Review is to give our members the opportunity to practice some of their entries prior to the 2023 Calumet County Fair. A fair judge will help each youth by sharing feedback on what they are looking for when judging a foods item, so when the youth does prepare an entry for the fair, they can make improvements. This is a great learning opportunity and a lot of fun!

Entries must be prepared and displayed by the exhibitor; no prepackaged mixes. Exhibitors in 3rd grade and older must display one main dish with the recipe on a 3" x 5" card, meal menu, a place setting, and a placemat/tablecloth and centerpiece, corresponding to the meal theme. Cloverbud exhibitors must display one dish (does not need to be a main dish) with a recipe on a 3" x 5" card, meal menu, place setting and a placemat/tablecloth and centerpiece. Participants may use 4-H project books for recipe ideas or favorite family recipes.

All 4-H foods members, parents, and leaders are welcome to attend this food-judging seminar. A fair judge will be there to explain what a judge looks for when judging a foods item.

### 2023 Cupcake Wars

#### Approximate Schedule of the Contest:

Cloverbuds (5K-2) & Grades 3-5

Grades 6-13 & Adults

Final Awards & Announcements (Byron Hacker Best of Show Award) 1:00-2:00 pm - Decorate Cupcakes 2:00-2:30 pm - Judging & Awards 2:00-3:00 pm - Decorate Cupcakes 3:00-3:30 pm - Judging & Awards 3:30 pm

#### **Rules:**

- 1. All youth must be a 4-H member, with the exception of adults. Members do not need to be a member of the Foods & Nutrition or Cake Decorating Projects.
- 2. This can count as a Food Workshop requirement to be eligible for this year's Food Auction.
- 3. Cupcakes must be made from scratch. Cloverbuds can use a cake mix.
- 4. Teams should be made up of 2 or 3 individuals.
- 5. Each group bakes and brings 6 "naked" cupcakes, and 4 will be judged as part of the contest.
- 6. Team needs to bring printed copies of their recipe for the judges.
- 7. Participants are responsible for purchasing their own ingredients and supplies. Calumet County 4-H does have cake decorating tools available for all to use at a first come, first serve basis.
- 8. Members can use icing or fondant, either homemade or store bought.
- 9. Icing or fondant should not be colored or tinted prior to the contest.
- 10. Each team will bring the icing mixed in bowls. Teams will place icing in piping bags at the contest.
- 11. Only edible items can be used for decorations.
- 12. Each team has 1 hour to decorate their cupcakes.
- 13. Cell phones are not allowed to be used.
- 14. Adult leaders can be onsite, but cannot assist with decorating the cupcakes or putting the display together.
- 15. The high school foods lab will be available for cleaning of tools and utensils.
- 16. Select a theme or name for the entry. 4 cupcakes will be presented as a group. They can each be decorated the same or with a theme, but should relate to the theme.
- 17. Each team is judged separately by two judges simultaneously.
- 18. Every member of the team must be in the room for judging.
- 19. Every member of the team must help to clean up the work area used for decorating.
- 20. A 1st, 2nd, and 3rd placing will be given out to each age category for decorations, and each age category will also have a single winner for bite-ability. A *Byron Hacker Best of Show Award* will be given across all age categories to one single winner.

#### Team Presentation:

Each team will present a verbal presentation to the judge describing their team's efforts. Describing the steps your team followed to create your display:

- How your team decisions
- How you decided on your cake and frosting recipe
- How your team incorporated the theme in your display
- Skills your team needed to practice

- How you made and decorated your cupcake and created your display
- Role each person on the team played in creating your Cupcake Wars product
- What your team learned because of your participation

### **Calumet County 4-H Horse Project**



### 2023 Calumet County Fair Promotional Billboard Competition THEME: "Livin' It Up!"



The Calumet County Fair Association will again sponsor the 18th annual billboard competition to promote the 2023 Calumet County Fair.

#### **Requirements and Rules:**

1. Must complete the easy online entry form by June 1, 2023

a. Go to the following website - <a href="https://form.jotform.com/230855015382150">https://form.jotform.com/230855015382150</a>

- 2. Each participating club will be supplied with a 4'x8' board to use for this application. Post for display will also be supplied. The board is the property of the Calumet County Fair Association. Most clubs that have participated in the past have their boards. All clubs are encouraged to participate and if you need a board, contact <a href="https://ccfbillboard@gmail.com">ccfbillboard@gmail.com</a>
- 3. Boards are to be in place by July 15, 2023. Each club participating will be responsible for the placement of the board. Please make sure to get appropriate approval for placement abiding by city and/or county regulations on the placement. In an effort to vary the location of the billboards, your placement will be APPROVED after your entry has been received. If it is not approved, you will be notified via email by June 15, 2023.
- 4. Club members are to paint and construct these boards. Leaders and adults are encouraged to help, but please keep in mind that this is a youth project.
- 5. Keep in mind that your board needs to be simple and to the point. Most people will see these signs as they travel the roadways at 25-55 MPH! Your message needs to be conveyed in a split second of viewing.
- 6. Advertising billboards will be judged on the pre-judging Saturday of the Fair, and results will be posted on the opening day of the fair.
  - a. Billboards will be judged on the following areas:
    - i. Overall Artistic Impression
    - ii. Creative Impression of Theme
    - iii. Lettering (is it readable at the speed of the traffic)
    - iv. Attractiveness
    - v. Neatness/Quality
- 7. People's Choice Award will be voted on via the fair website at <u>www.calumetcountyfair.com</u>, voting will start on August 1st and proceed until August 30th at midnight. <u>A photo of the billboard MUST be submitted by July 15th to</u> <u>ccfbillboard@gmail.com</u>. If a photo is not submitted, your billboard will not appear in the voting tab on the website.
- 8. The color scheme we are using to promote the fair this year is Maroon and Yellow.
- 9. Requirements
  - a. Use "Livin' It Up!" as the theme.
  - b. Words: Calumet County Fair must be included on the board.
  - c. Date: Labor Day Weekend September 1-4, 2023
  - d. Club name should displayed on the lower right-hand corner and should be no larger than 6" letter in height

Each club will receive \$50 for their participation and will be recognized at the fair.

### **Calumet County 4-H Attendance Policy**

Members are required to attend a minimum of 1/3 of their club's annual meetings

- Grade 13 members (college/technical school) are exempt from attendance requirement, but are encouraged to attend as many club meetings as possible. Younger members gain from older youth interaction and positive role modeling.
- Members can be excused from 50 percent of their club's total number of meetings. Excused meetings do not count towards the attendance requirement.
  - Members need to be excused prior to the club meeting.
  - Each club should decide how and who to call for excused absences.
  - Approved excused absences include: church related activity, school functions, work, illness, family emergencies, other scheduled 4-H activities.
- <u>Clubs have the authority to set higher attendance requirements than this stated county policy.</u> (Check with your club leader for club rules and guidelines.)
- Youth who do not meet attendance requirements:
  - Will not be able to show at the county fair as a 4-H exhibitor

Main leaders will be expected to notify the 4-H Office about those members not meeting the attendance requirement. By June 1, the 4-H office will send a list of the enrolled members to the Main Leader of each club with a form to complete and return by August 1.

• Will not be eligible for honor trips and awards the following year.

Example: If a club holds 12 meetings in the year, the minimum requirement for a member is:

- 1. Must attend 4 meetings
- 2. Be excused from 6 meetings
- 3. Leaving 2 that would be unaccounted for
