Session 1 (9:00 - 9:50)

- 1A. **Fun with Art Printmaking** Youth and adults are invited to explore together basic printmaking techniques. We will create Monoprints that allow for considerable freedom in the approach and method. The processes we will explore present endless opportunities for experimentation. Develop your own style and learn by doing. Instructor: Jayna Hintz
- 1B. **Soda Bottle Rockets** Cloverbuds will be introduced to the rocketry project by learning how to make a simple paper rocket that we will then launch using soda bottles.
- 1C. **Dream Catcher** Youth will learn how to make a simple dream catcher using a paper plate. They will then be able to decorate it with strings and beads as they would like.
- 1D. **Recipe in a Jar** Youth will learn how to read a recipe and measure dry ingredients, while making a recipe in a jar you can then gift to someone.
- 1E. **Rubber Band Guns** Youth will get an introduction into the shooting sports project by learning the proper form and function of shooting rubber band guns. Instructor: Phil Hietpas

- 2A. **Fun with Art Printmaking** Youth and adults are invited to explore together basic printmaking techniques. - 5E. Edible Horse Treats You will be getting your hands sticky while mixing and forming molasses oat thumbprint horse treats and topping them with peppermint. These treats will be a hit with your equine (and possibly canine) friends, and you may also enjoy them. Instructor: Amy Suha

Session 6 (3:00 - 3:50)

- 6A. **Wooden Door Hanger** Youth will decorate their own 12" wooden door hanger. This will include painting, staining, selecting a saying, and decorating it with greens & a bow. Instructors: Sally & Tori Squires
- 6B. Mini Book Stack Youth will decorate a mini book stack for a season or holiday of their choice. Themed book stacks are a cute way to decorate for any holiday or season, and you can add a saying of your choice. Instructors: Christina & Sarah Schnell
- 6C. **Melted Crayon Art** Youth will design a canvas piece using crayons and melt them to add an additional layer of creativity and expression.
- 6D. **Bottle Top Craft** Up-cycle lids and bottle tops to create a flower and/or hanging decoration and/or windchime. Using adhesive and your imagination, bottle tops are applied to the can lid to create decoration suitable for indoor or outdoor display. These make great markers for the garden! Instructor: Amy Suha
- 6E. **Edible Cookie Dough** Do you like licking the spoon? Then you'll want to make edible cookie dough! You will learn some basic kitchen safety while also learning how to read a recipe and how to measure ingredients.
- 6F. **Yarn Pumpkins** Make a cute DIY yarn pumpkin using cut up pool noodles and yarn of your choice. This will make a cute decoration for Fall!
