Leaders Council Board Meeting Highlights

On Wednesday, September 12th, the Calumet County 4-H Leaders Council held their semi-annual meeting at the Calumet County Courthouse. During the meeting, President Jessie Jansen introduced officers elected to the Executive Board. The board went over the progress of the goals from the 2022-2023 4-H year, and spent time with those in attendance to draft the 2023-2024 goals. The Leaders Council voted and approved the purchase of a new ice cream machine for the food stand for the cost of \$4,800. Leaders Council Treasurer shared the Food Stand Report and the Foods Auction report at the meeting, along with mentioning that checks are in the mail for those who were shift leaders and who sold in this year's foods auction. 4-H Program Educator, Carlea Liermann, shared the enrollment report for the last 4-H year and participation numbers for the different programs that took place for the last year.

Leaders Council Upcoming Meeting

The next Calumet County 4-H Leaders Council Executive Board meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, October 11, at 7:00pm at the Calumet County Courthouse in Room #025. During the meeting, the board will decide on the 2023-2024 theme contest winner, which will then be the theme for the Fair booths and window display themes for 4-H week. The board will also discuss and vote on the redesign of the raffle tickets for the 4-H dance, insurance coverage for the food stand, and discuss the recognition night planned for Sunday, November 12th at the Chilton High School at 4:00pm.

The Calumet County 4-H Teen Ambassadors are meeting on Thursday, October 19th, following the monthly Cloverbud Club meeting. We ask that Teen Ambassadors come to help with the October meeting. Looking for Volunteers

We are currently looking for volunteers to assist with specific countywide programs we offer here in Calumet County:

Cloverbud Club - Cloverbud Club continues to grow every year, and we are in need of at least 1-2 additional adult volunteers to help coordinate and run the monthly Cloverbud Club meetings. Group A meets at 5:30-6:30pm and Group B meets at 6:00-7:00pm every 3rd Thursday of the month. Volunteers would run the meetings, hands-on activities, and help create the welcoming environment for Cloverbuds and their families who attend the meetings. The 4-H office handles registration, gathering of supplies for meetings, and all correspondence to Cloverbud Families. Teen Ambassadors also assist with the monthly meetings.

Explorers - With the growth of Cloverbud Club, the idea has been brought up to create and launch an Explorers Club here in Calumet County. This new program would be for youth in grades 3-5 who may be new to 4-H or who would like to explore the different projects that we have in 4-H. The members would help decide what projects the program will discover and look into more, and we would love a volunteer to help coordinate and organize this new program.

Food Workshops - We are in the process of planning the next year of Food Workshops for 4-H members, and we are in need of volunteers or adults with the expertise to help run Food Workshops this year. This could include cake decorating, how to use the different tips or how to decorate a cake with fondant. We are also looking for those experienced with baking to help lead in, example yeast dough workshops or other workshops that help learn important life skills and kitchen safety. Volunteers who wish to lead a Food Workshop will get to choose a date and time that works best for them, and will work with Carlea to determine the outcomes for the workshop.

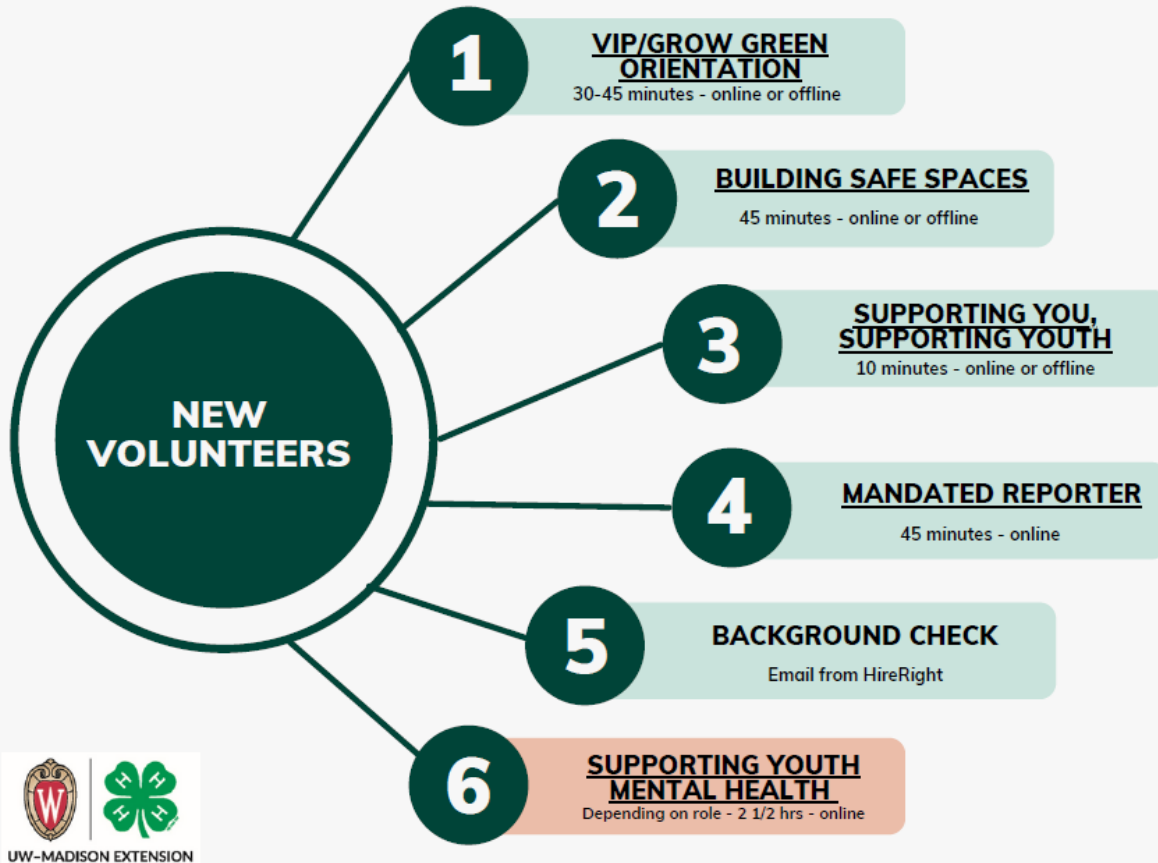
Have you signed up for the 2023-2024 Cloverbud Club?

The Calumet County 4-H Cloverbud Club is open to any youth in grades 5K-2nd. The goal of the program is to engage the youngest members of 4-H, so they can learn what 4-H is about with hands-on activities and exposure to the different project areas. Youth get to meet others their own age from all around Calumet County. Activities and meetings are designed just for them and their age groups.

Monthly meetings take place at the Calumet County Courthouse on the 3rd Thursday of each month with Group A at 5:30-6:30pm and Group B at 6:00-7:00pm. You and your family will select and attend the group time that works best for you. Usually, they last around 45 minutes to an hour. Cost is \$10 for the year to cover the cost of supplies.

Youth can be part of a traditional Community Club as well as Cloverbud Club. To sign up, please join the Cloverbud Club on 4HOnline. You can select it to be your primary club or your secondary club. Please reach out to our office if you have any questions on this!

Volunteer Training Requirements



Nominations are being accepted for the following four awards:

Friend of 4-H - Award given each year to a business or an individual (NOT a 4-H leader) that has been a strong supporter of the 4-H program.

Special Leadership Award - Two to three awards are given each year to 4-H volunteers who have made significant contributions to the 4-H program at a club or county level over the course of their 4-H career.

4-H Volunteer of the Year - One award is given per year to a 4-H volunteer who has made significant contributions of time and effort to the 4-H program during the recent year(s). This award is for individuals with less than 10 years of service at the local, county, district, or state level.

Lifetime Volunteer of the Year - One award is given per year to a 4-H volunteer who has made significant contributions of time and effort to the 4-H program during their volunteer career. This award is for individuals with 10 or more years of service at the local, county, district, or state level.

Please nominate individuals with an explanation of why you think they are deserving of the awards by contacting Carlea at 920-849-1450, 920-483-0646, or carlea.liermann@wisc.edu. If you do not know if a volunteer has more than 10 years or less than 10 years of service, please nominate them for both awards and we will place them in the correct category.

Arts Camp provides older youth and adults with opportunities to teach and strengthen their leadership abilities and provides younger youth the fun of a 4-H camping experience focused on the arts. Cost is \$110/youth. Scholarships are available to help offset the cost, if needed.

The purpose of Art Camp:

- Encouraging expression and participation in the arts with middle school-age youth
- Supporting youth teaching opportunities where they learn to incorporate education, creativity, and reflection into the creative process
- Increasing awareness of the arts and participation in the arts at the club level

Are you a middle schooler looking for an opportunity to explore the arts through 4-H? If so, you don't want to miss Wisconsin 4-H Arts Camp! This state-level experience offers one place for youth, grades 6-8, to learn about topics like music, drama, visual arts, photography, communications, and more! You'll rotate through the different arts tracks each day, participate in various group activities throughout, and close with a ceremony for parents and families, celebrating the results of your Arts Camp experience. You'll also meet new friends, participate in camp games, and enjoy the great natural setting of Upham Woods, a 300-acre environmental education center on the Wisconsin River near Wisconsin Dells.

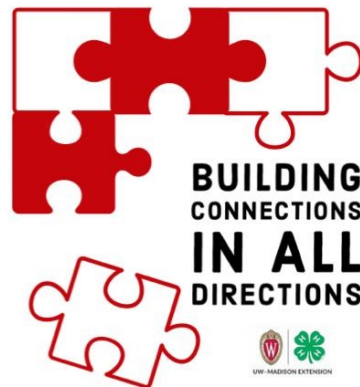

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Calumet County Livestock & Skill-a-thon Teams

We are currently looking for youth who would like to start preparing for the statewide competitions that will take place this Spring.

What are the contests?

These are two different contests all about livestock where you can use your knowledge about the animal species (beef, sheep, swine, meat goat) and the industry.

- **Livestock Quiz Bowl:**

Livestock Bowl is a quiz competition where all the questions are about beef, sheep, swine, and meat goat topics. Students use a buzzer to answer the questions (similar to the game show Jeopardy). Teams compete in a double-elimination format by giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. Each match has both an individual and toss-up question round. The top team earns the opportunity to compete at the national competition.


- **Livestock Skill-a-thon:**

Everything you know about raising your animal adds up to so much knowledge of the species and the industry. The Skill-a-thon contest will help you challenge you to share that information through a written quiz and leaning stations such as breed identification, feed identification, equipment identification as well as some team activities such as demonstrating evaluation skills. There are both individual and team stations. The top team earn the opportunity to compete at the national competition.

Who can participate?

Any current 4-H members, grades 3-13. Please note, there are age divisions for each of those contests and parameters for grade 13 members. Even if your county has not participated in the past, round up come 4-H friends and take advantage of this fun opportunity to show your knowledge of the animal species and industry.

***Youth who participate will receive credit towards their educational sessions required for the market animal sale.*

Participant Eligibility

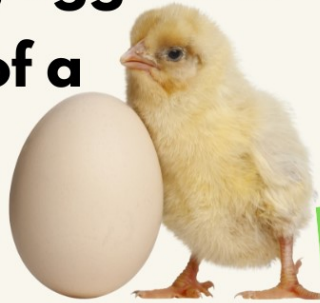
- All youth grades 8-10
- Pre-registration in 4H Online 2.0 is open starting October 1-November 15, 2023. Youth and their parent/guardian must complete the online registration together; it includes questions for the youth participant to answer!
- Each experience is limited to 44 youth. Decisions about who is selected to travel are based on the following factors:
 - # of youth per experience
 - Full rooms by identified gender
 - Ages of youth traveling together
 - Eligibility to participate in future years
 - The committee does take into account registration dates & times

Estimated Cost of Experience = \$1,900 (the 4-H office will send in the payment and invoice youth prior to traveling)

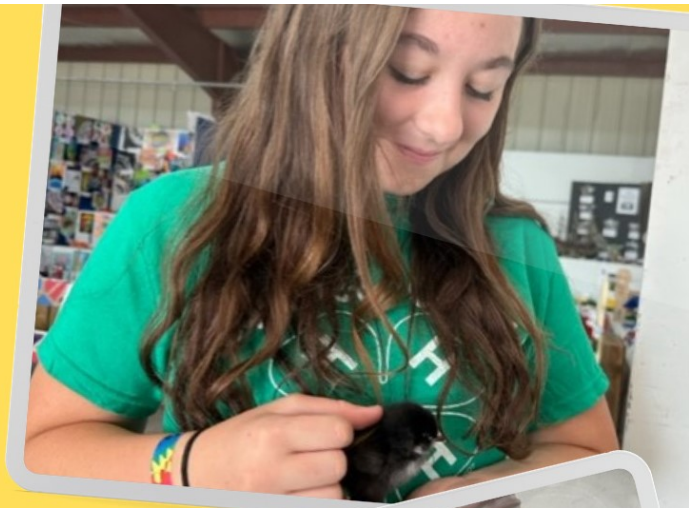

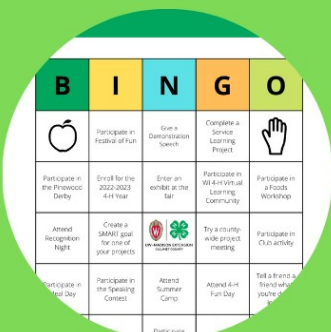

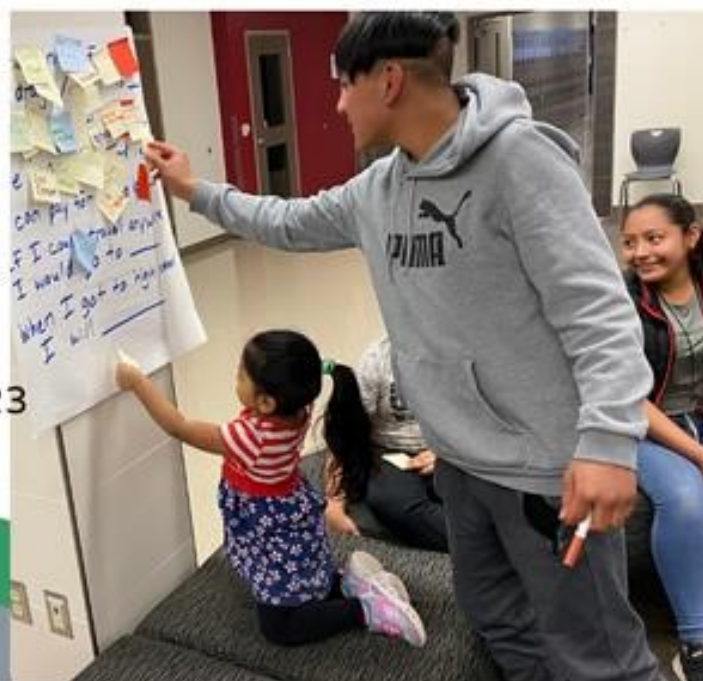
