They also selected who will be awarded the specialty awards at the annual recognition banquet, which will be shared at the event on Sunday, November 12th.

# 2024 Annual Pinewood Derby

A popular event for our 4-H program last year is returning in 2024, and it is open to all 4-H members (Cloverbuds through 13th grade), adults, and even non-4-H members! Invite your friends to join you!

A pinewood derby is a racing event where you build your own car from kits containing a block of pine, plastic wheels, and metal axles. The Leaders Council will purchase the kits for our 4-H members to participate! If an adult or non-4-H participant would like to compete as well, they would need to pay \$5.00 for their kit. Blocks can be whittled with a hand knife, bandsaw, or Dremel carving tool for major shaping. Decals can be bought to decorate your car, or you are encouraged to use your imagination to paint and decorate the way you'd like!

## Have you signed up for the 2023-2024 Cloverbud Club?

The Calumet County 4-H Cloverbud Club is open to any youth in grades 5K -2nd. The goal of the program is to engage the youngest members of 4-H, so they can learn what 4-H is about with hands-on activities and exposure to the different project areas. Youth get to meet others their own age from all around Calumet County. Activities and meetings are designed just for them and their age groups.

Monthly meetings take place at the Calumet County Courthouse on the 3rd Thursday of each month with Group A at 5:30-6:30pm and Group B at 6:00-7:00pm. You and your family will select and attend the group time that works best for you. Usually, they last around 45 minutes to an hour. Cost is \$10 for the year to cover the cost of supplies.


# **UW-Meat Science Trip**

## **Calumet County Livestock & Skill-a-thon Teams**

We are currently looking for youth who would like to start preparing for the statewide competitions that will take place this Spring.

## What are the contests?

These are two different contests all about livestock where you can use your knowledge about the animal species (beef, sheep, swine, meat goat) and the industry.

## Livestock Quiz Bowl:

Livestock Bowl is a quiz competition where all the questions are about beef, sheep, swine, and meat goat topics. Students use a buzzer to answer the questions (similar to the game show Jeopardy). Teams compete in a double-elimination format by giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. Each match has both an individual and toss-up question round. The top team earns the opportunity to compete at the national competition.

## • Livestock Skill-a-thon:

Everything you know about raising your animal adds up to so much knowledge of the species and the industry. The Skill-a-thon contest will help you challenge you to share that information through a written quiz and leaning stations such as breed identification, feed identification, equipment identification as well as some team activities such as demonstrating evaluation skills. There are both individual and team stations. The top team earn the opportunity to compete at the national competition.

## Who can participate?

Any current 4-H members, grades 3-13. Please note, there are age divisions for each of those contests and parameters for grade 13 members. Even if your county has not participated in the past, round up come 4-H friends and take advantage of this fun opportunity to show your knowledge of the animal species and industry.

\*\*Youth who participate will receive credit towards their educational sessions required for the market animal sale.


The 2024 State Arts Team and Drama Company applications are NOW OPEN until January 16th, 2024.

# **American Spirit Registration Opens October 1st**

## About 4-H American Spirit - June 14-23, June 21-30, and July 5-14, 2024

The 4-H American Spirit Experience is an opportunity for youth 8-10 grades to experience history & heritage by immersing in a 10-day bus journey to the East Coast and Canada. Staff and volunteers plan and facilitate the experience, with youth participants leading content throughout the experience. Participants increase their knowledge of American history while experiencing where it occurred and have unique opportunities for dynamic exposure to diverse cultural experiences and perspectives of the foundation of our nation, all while developing positive relationships with adults and their peers from around the state.

## American Spirit Experience Objectives for its Participants:

- Increase knowledge and understanding of America's heritage
- Build awareness of the many steps taken to gain U.S. independence and freedom
- Further develop skills in leadership and personal expression of values
- Increase awareness of self in relationship to others
- Share what was learned with others in your club and county

## **Participant Eligibility**

- All youth grades 8-10
- Pre-registration in 4H Online 2.0 is open starting October 1-November 15, 2023. Youth and their parent/ guardian must complete the online registration together; it includes questions for the youth participant to answer!
- Each experience is limited to 44 youth. Decisions about who is selected to travel are base on the following factors:
  - # of youth per experience
  - Full rooms by identified gender
  - Ages of youth traveling together
  - Eligibility to participate in future years
  - The committee does take into account registration dates & times

**Estimated Cost of Experience** = \$1,900 (the 4-H office will send in the payment and invoice youth prior to traveling)
