Leaders Council Board Meeting Highlights

The Leaders Council Board met on Wednesday, November 8th at the Calumet County Courthouse at 7pm. The board decided to have the Family Fun Day also be our Opportunity Fair, and discussed who would be able to help that day. Maggie shared more about the Youth in Governance Program, and how local teens will be on county board committees to bring their voice to decision making. Some other county programs that will be taking place: UW-Meat Science Tour, Teen Travel Experience, Cooking with Meat Project Box, and Skill-a-thon.

The board also discussed insurance for the food stand that is purchased through the Fair Board. Due to the funds that were raised this year, the board does need to hire an accountant to file taxes per federal law. They also approved the purchase of food for the recognition dinner.

Next Meeting

The next Leaders Council meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, January 10th at 7pm in Room #025 of the Calumet County Courthouse. During the meeting, the board will discuss the upcoming Family Fun Day and go over the schedule and the roles/ support needed for the day. The final details for the 4-H Dance and raffle will also be discussed. The board will also be discussing the fair food stand for 2024. The 4-H Educator will also give updates on winter programming.

Key Award

This award is the top honor a 4-H member can achieve in 4-H in Wisconsin. Two awards can be given this year in Calumet County. Also, the key award winners will have the opportunity to be a recipient of the Cheri Sattler Memorial Scholarship.

Qualifications: at least 14 years old on January 1, 2024, and completed at least three years of 4-H and one year of youth leadership.

2024 Annual Pinewood Derby

A popular event for our 4-H program last year is returning in 2024, and it is open to all 4-H members (Cloverbuds through 13th grade), adults, and even non-4-H members! Invite your friends to join you!

A pinewood derby is a racing event where you build your own car from kits containing a block of pine, plastic wheels, and metal axles. The Leaders Council will purchase the kits for our 4-H members to participate! If an adult or non-4-H participant would like to compete as well, they would need to pay \$5.00 for their kit. Blocks can be whittled with a hand knife, bandsaw, or Dremel carving tool for major shaping. Decals can be bought to decorate your car, or you are encouraged to use your imagination to paint and decorate the way you'd like!

Have you signed up for the 2023-2024 Cloverbud Club?

The Calumet County 4-H Cloverbud Club is open to any youth in grades 5K -2nd. The goal of the program is to engage the youngest members of 4-H, so they can learn what 4-H is about with hands-on activities and exposure to the different project areas. Youth get to meet others their own age from all around Calumet County. Activities and meetings are designed just for them and their age groups.

Monthly meetings take place at the Calumet County Courthouse on the 3rd Thursday of each month with Group A at 5:30-6:30pm and Group B at 6:00-7:00pm. You and your family will select and attend the group time that works best for you. Usually, they last around 45 minutes to an hour. Cost is \$10 for the year to cover the cost of supplies.

Lego Robotics


Have you signed up for 2024 Lego Robotics?

Calumet County Livestock & Skill-a-thon Teams

Mark your calendars for the upcoming 4-H Livestock Quiz Bowl and Skill-a-thon Contest! If you have participated in the past or this is the first time you are hearing about the contest, we would love to have you join us for this day of learning, fun, and competition.

What are the contests?

These are two different contests all about livestock where you can use your knowledge about the animal species (beef, sheep, swine, meat goat) and the industry.

Livestock Quiz Bowl:

Livestock Bowl is a quiz competition where all the questions are about beef, sheep, swine, and meat goat topics. Students use a buzzer to answer the questions (similar to the game show Jeopardy). Teams compete in a double-elimination format by giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. Each match has both an individual and toss-up question round. The top team earns the opportunity to compete at the national competition.

Livestock Skill-a-thon:

Everything you know about raising your animal adds up to so much knowledge of the species and the industry. The Skill-a-thon contest will help you challenge you to share that information through a written quiz and leaning stations such as breed identification, feed identification, equipment identification as well as some team activities such as demonstrating evaluation skills. There are both individual and team stations. The top team earn the opportunity to compete at the national competition.

Who can participate?

Any current 4-H members, grades 3-13. Please note, there are age divisions for each of those contests and parameters for grade 13 members. Even if your county has not participated in the past, round up some 4-H friends and take advantage of this fun opportunity to show your knowledge of the animal species and industry.

Looking for more information, where to register, or resources to study from? If you are interested in participating in the Skillathon or Quiz Bowl, please reach out to our office as we are starting to coordinate practices! First practice will be Monday, January 8th at 6pm.

**Youth who participate will receive credit towards their educational sessions required for the market animal sale.



Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Scholarships

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will award more than \$20,000 in scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin 4-H members and alumni pursuing higher education in 2024. To be considered for financial support, applications will be accepted **starting December 15, 2023**, and must be received by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation via email **by Friday, March 1, 2024, at 5:00pm**.

Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth through 4-H, development and leadership in 4-H, academic performance and future educational goals.

To be eligible for Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships students must have been a Wisconsin 4-H member for at least three years; should have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college or technical school during the 2024-2025 academic school year. Scholarship winners from previous years are not eligible to receive a second 4-H Foundation scholarship.

All applications must adhere to the conventions outlined below. Any application that does not meet these requirements will not be considered. All documents must be emailed to the 4-H Foundation as one, two-page PDF. Any other cloud/internet shared documents will NOT be accepted (do NOT use Google Docs, for example).

The application materials represent what youth may be asked to submit when applying for jobs. We encourage applicants to treat this process as if applying for a position. For help with creating cover letters and résumés, applicants should reach out to their club leaders, county educator, or a teacher or parent. 2024 Communications Contest

The 4-H Communications Contest will be held on Tuesday, February 20, 2024, at the Calumet County Courthouse in Room #025. Registration is required by February 13, 2024. Grade divisions and time limits are listed below:

Demonstration Guidelines -

Grades K-2 (2-6 minutes)

Grades 3-5 (2-7 minutes) Grades 6-8 (4-8 minutes)

Grades 9+ (5-10 minutes)

Show how to do something and explain each step. A demonstration table with an overhead mirror and easel will be provided. A poster or tri-fold should be used as a visual.

Original Speech (known as speaking contest) Guidelines -

Grades K-2 (2-4 minutes)

Grades 3-5 (2-4 minutes)

Grades 6-8 (5-7 minutes)

Grades 9+ (5-7 minutes)

Pick a topic of your choice and write an original, factual speech about it. This could be about a 4-H project you love or a current issue you are concerned about. Your speech could inform, persuade, or motivate your audience. Your entire speech or an outline of your speech can be put on notecards for use during your presentation, or it may be memorized. You may also use visuals (posters, charts, diagrams, power point) to help you deliver your speech, but NOT props or costumes. (Keep in mind, this is a speech, not a demonstration)

Interpretive Speech Guideline -

Grades K-2 (2-4 minutes)

Grades 3-5 (2-4 minutes)

Grades 6-8 (5-7 minutes)

Grades 9+ (5-7 minutes)

A memorized introduction should be included to credit the author. The options include: prose reading, poetry reading, a memorized piece, storytelling (where the story is told and not read), or an interpretive speech (a speech that had originally been written and presented by someone else). You may edit your selection to meet the time requirement. Original poetry or stories can also be used. You should write an introduction and any transitions that are needed if you have more than one piece. Cloverbuds are permitted to read, and not memorize. Props or costumes are encouraged.

Readers Theater & Storytelling Guidelines -

Grades K-2 (2-4 minutes)

Grades 3-5 (2-4 minutes)

Grades 6-8 (5-7 minutes)

Grades 9+ (5-7 minutes)

Storytelling can be read or memorized and should include interaction between the audience and storyteller. <u>Interview Contest Guidelines</u> - Youth in grades 3 & above are invited to participate in the first interview contest. Each participant will have a scheduled interview on the night of February 23rd. These interviews will be similar to Educational Experience Scholarship Interviews, where it will be based off of your 4-H experience. Youth will be asked to submit a cover letter and resume prior to the registration deadline of February 15th, so the interviewer has time to review ahead of time.
