Dear Calumet County 4-H,

How are we already in the month of February!?! Now is a great time to work on your 4-H projects. For example, poultry and rabbit meetings start this month, along with there are still some food workshops available. YQCA and other market animal education meetings will come out sometime in February as well.

Some other things you may want to take a look at are as follows:

<u>Calumet County Youth in Governance (YiG) Program</u> - Youth ages 14-18 who live in Calumet County are eligible to apply to be part of the first ever YiG program, where you would sit on one of the county committees with county board members. More information is available on page 3.

<u>Earrings Workshop</u> - Youth in middle school and older are eligible to join in 1 of 2 earrings workshops we have set with 4-H alum, Izzy Bastian. She took one of her sparks and turned it into a business.

<u>Leaders Council Exec Board</u> - We will be looking to fill 3 adult director and 4 youth director positions on the Leaders Council Board. Meetings are monthly, with the exception of May and December and have typically been on Wednesday evenings at 7pm. The new council will set their own meeting schedule. The new executive board will be voted on at the annual meeting scheduled for Wednesday, April 10th at 7pm.

<u>ArtBEAT!</u> - is a day camp program for youth in grades 3-5, which is an introductory program for the 4-H Expressive Arts. It will take place at Upham Woods, and scholarships are available!

During the regular meeting, the board will start planning the semi-annual audit, the 2024-2025 budget meeting, and will discuss upcoming programming.

Youth in Governance

The Youth in Governance (YiG) application is now open for the 2024-2025 year! Apply today to be a part of the first ever cohort of Youth in Governance representatives for Calumet County! You can apply online by scanning the QR code below with your phone, or you can fill out a paper application and return it to the Extension Office. Applications are due March 8th, 2024, and the program will begin in May and end the following May.

For those who do not know what the Youth in Governance Program is, it's an opportunity for teens (ages 14-18) to get involved in county government and to develop their leadership skills. Youth will get an advisory vote on their chosen committees and a mentor that sits on their chosen board. Committee meetings are typically held during the school day, once per month for about 2.5 hours, so keep that in mind when applying. Youth are allowed to attend committee meetings virtually. Youth will also be required to attend YiG cohort meetings, where they will get to get together and discuss how the program is going and do activities to develop their leadership and communication skills. If your teen is not interested in this program, please spread the word to those you think would be interested! Youth have to be in high school, ages 14-18, and live in Calumet County to apply.

Calumet County Livestock & Skill-a-thon Teams

Mark your calendars for the upcoming 4-H Livestock Quiz Bowl and Skill-a-thon Contest! If you have participated in the past or this is the first time you are hearing about the contest, we would love to have you join us for this day of learning, fun, and competition.

What are the contests?

These are two different contests all about livestock where you can use your knowledge about the animal species (beef, sheep, swine, meat goat) and the industry.

Livestock Quiz Bowl:

Livestock Bowl is a quiz competition where all the questions are about beef, sheep, swine, and meat goat topics. Students use a buzzer to answer the questions (similar to the game show Jeopardy). Teams compete in a double-elimination format by giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. Each match has both an individual and toss-up question round. The top team earns the opportunity to compete at the national competition.

Livestock Skill-a-thon:

Everything you know about raising your animal adds up to so much knowledge of the species and the industry. The Skill-a-thon contest will help you challenge you to share that information through a written quiz and leaning stations such as breed identification, feed identification, equipment identification as well as some team activities such as demonstrating evaluation skills. There are both individual and team stations. The top team earn the opportunity to compete at the national competition.

Who can participate?

Any current 4-H members, grades 3-13. Please note, there are age divisions for each of those contests and parameters for grade 13 members. Even if your county has not participated in the past, round up some 4-H friends and take advantage of this fun opportunity to show your knowledge of the animal species and industry.

Looking for more information, where to register, or resources to study from? If you are interested in participating in the Skillathon or Quiz Bowl, please reach out to our office as we are starting to coordinate practices! First practice will be Monday, January 8th at 6pm.

**Youth who participate will receive credit towards their educational sessions required for the market animal sale.



Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Scholarships

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will award more than \$20,000 in scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin 4-H members and alumni pursuing higher education in 2024. To be considered for financial support, applications will be accepted **starting December 15, 2023**, and must be received by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation via email **by Friday, March 1, 2024**, at **5:00pm**.

Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth through 4-H, development and leadership in 4-H, academic performance and future educational goals.

To be eligible for Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships students must have been a Wisconsin 4-H member for at least three years; should have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college or technical school during the 2024-2025 academic school year. Scholarship winners from previous years are not eligible to receive a second 4-H Foundation scholarship.

All applications must adhere to the conventions outlined below. Any application that does not meet these requirements will not be considered. All documents must be emailed to the 4-H Foundation as one, two-page PDF. Any other cloud/internet shared documents will NOT be accepted (do NOT use Google Docs, for example).

The application materials represent what youth may be asked to submit when applying for jobs. We encourage applicants to treat this process as if applying for a position. 2024 Communications Contest

The 4-H Communications Contest will be held on Tuesday, February 20, 2024, at the Calumet County Courthouse in Room #025. Registration is required by February 13, 2024.

Grade divisions and time limits are listed below:

Demonstration Guidelines -

Grades K-2 (2-6 minutes)

Grades 3-5 (2-7 minutes) Grades 6-8 (4-8 minutes)

Grades 9+ (5-10 minutes)

Show how to do something and explain each step. A demonstration table with an overhead mirror and easel will be provided. A poster or tri-fold should be used as a visual.

Original Speech (known as speaking contest) Guidelines -

Grades K-2 (2-4 minutes)

Grades 3-5 (2-4 minutes)

Grades 6-8 (5-7 minutes)

Grades 9+ (5-7 minutes)

Pick a topic of your choice and write an original, factual speech about it. This could be about a 4-H project you love or a current issue you are concerned about. Your speech could inform, persuade, or motivate your audience. Your entire speech or an outline of your speech can be put on notecards for use during your presentation, or it may be memorized. You may also use visuals (posters, charts, diagrams, power point) to help you deliver your speech, but NOT props or costumes. (Keep in mind, this is a speech, not a demonstration)

Interpretive Speech Guideline -

Grades K-2 (2-4 minutes)

Grades 3-5 (2-4 minutes)

Grades 6-8 (5-7 minutes)

Grades 9+ (5-7 minutes)

A memorized introduction should be included to credit the author. The options include: prose reading, poetry reading, a memorized piece, storytelling (where the story is told and not read), or an interpretive speech (a speech that had originally been written and presented by someone else). You may edit your selection to meet the time requirement. Original poetry or stories can also be used. You should write an introduction and any transitions that are needed if you have more than one piece. Cloverbuds are permitted to read, and not memorize. Props or costumes are encouraged.

Readers Theater & Storytelling Guidelines -

Grades K-2 (2-4 minutes)

Grades 3-5 (2-4 minutes)

Grades 6-8 (5-7 minutes)

Grades 9+ (5-7 minutes)

Storytelling can be read or memorized and should include interaction between the audience and storyteller. <u>Interview Contest Guidelines</u> - Youth in grades 3 & above are invited to participate in the first interview contest. Each participant will have a scheduled interview on the night of February 23rd. These interviews will be similar to Educational Experience Scholarship Interviews, where it will be based off of your 4-H experience. Youth will be asked to submit a cover letter and resume prior to the registration deadline of February 15th, so the interviewer has time to review ahead of time.
