Leaders Council Board Meeting Highlights

The Food Stand Committee met on Wednesday, February 14th at 6:30pm to hear from the Calumet County Fair Board on their proposal to move to their Fair Food Stand. Following the proposal and discussion, the Leaders Council Exec Board held their monthly meeting. During the meeting, they reviewed the Family Fun Day and created the new Outreach Committee. The new committee will work with Carlea this Summer to help with any outreach, back-to-school events, or 4-H promotion at the Calumet County Fair. The Teen Ambassadors also gave an update on their Craft Fair/Brat Fry they have scheduled for Sunday, April 28th, to help fund their Teen Travel Experience to Tennessee. Before the meeting wrapped up, the Exec Board set dates for the semi-annual audit and budget meeting, which is schedule for Tuesday, February 27th at 5:30pm. Lastly, the board discussed plans on how to make a decision on the food stand proposal.

Next Meeting

The next Leaders Council Exec Meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, March 13th at 7pm. During this meeting, they will go over plans for the Fair Food Stand proposal, discuss and vote on the proposed 2024-2025 budget, and plan for the annual meeting that will take place on Wednesday, April 10th at 7pm. The board also invites any current volunteer or teen in grades 9 & up who is interested in running for a seat on the board to attend this meeting.

Youth in Governance

The Youth in Governance (YiG) application is now open for the 2024-2025 year! Apply today to be a part of the first ever cohort of Youth in Governance representatives for Calumet County! You can apply online by scanning the QR code below with your phone, or you can fill out a paper application and return it to the Extension Office. Applications are due March 8th, 2024 and the program will begin in May and end the following May.

For those who do not know what the Youth in Governance Program is, it's an opportunity for teens (ages 14-18) to get involved in county government and to develop their leadership skills. Youth will get an advisory vote on their chosen committees and a mentor that sits on their chosen board. Committee meetings are typically held during the school day, once per month for about 2.5 hours, so keep that in mind when applying. Youth are allowed to attend committee meetings virtually. Youth will also be required to attend YiG cohort meetings, where they will get to get together and discuss how the program is going and do activities to develop their leadership and communication skills. If your teen is not interested in this program, please spread the word to those you think would be interested! Youth have to be in high school, ages 14-18, and live in Calumet County to apply.

Looking for Volunteers

Cloverbud Club Lead

We are looking for at least 1 adult to help lead Group A (5:30-6:30pm) of our monthly Cloverbud Club group. Activities are planned for the month, so all you need to do is use the Cloverbud Club Activity Book to run each meeting. Supplies are provided by the 4-H office for each meeting. Leads from both Group A and Group B then help plan the activities for the next year, which are planned out in advance.



Share-a-Kid Program

Each year, the Wisconsin Dairy Goat Association promotes interest in dairy goats in our state. One of the ways we encourage our young people in this aspect of agriculture is through our Share-a-Kid Program. We award an average of 4-6 dairy goat kids with young people across the state each year. Some years we have been able to award more.

The selection committee will meet and choose winners. Everyone will be notified by mid-May about the status of their entry. Entries will be accepted from January 1 until April 1.

Volunteer Training & Orientation

Volunteers may remember participating in VIP (Volunteers in Preparation). Now, we are shifting to a new version of orientation called "Grow Green." This is a new, interactive orientation that is available online or available in a paper format to be read offline. It is designed to be taken whenever convenient for the potential new volunteer.

A little bit more about Grown Green:



- Two short, interactive modules one module is an introduction to volunteering in Extension and Wisconsin 4-H, and a second module that is geared towards a specific volunteer role. Combined, this orientation should take around 45 minutes to complete.
- Lots of practical tips in the training modules, new volunteers will learn about some of the 4-H guiding principles (Essential Elements, Life Skills Development, Ages & Stages of Youth) and gain some really practical tips to use as a volunteer.
- Start and stop at your leisure if you start the training and need to step away, you can come back to the website using the same device you started with and it will pick up where you left off.

We are hopeful that this will make orientation more convenient and beneficial! This orientation is required for new volunteers, but it is available online for all volunteers to take as a refresher.



Baking Project Boxes

Thank you to the support from the Calumet County 4-H Leaders Council in helping to coordinate and fund Project Boxes. 4-H engages youth in project-based education. Through project learning, youth can dive deeper into their interests and passions, ultimately mastering new skills. 4-H projects are meant to be hands-on to create a memorable learning experience. Project Boxes are an opportunity for hands-on learning. All of the boxes include either 4-H curriculum or instructions for self-directed learning. Some supplies will be included, and other supplies will be basic supplies found around the house or will need to be purchased. Some of the boxes will have some independent learning activities and some will include either a recording that youth may watch to help further their project learning and understanding.

Cost: \$5 Calumet County 4-H Youth and \$10 Other county 4-H members and non-4-H youth

<u>Project Box Pick-up Date:</u> Thursday, April 18, 4:00-5:00 pm - If you are unable to make this pick-up time, you can schedule an appointment to pick up your Project Boxes on a week day following the pick-up date.

Biscuits vs Scones -

This is for youth who have experience baking in the kitchen! Youth will learn how to make both biscuits and scones, while learning the difference between the two. There is a recording from William Sonoma's Baking School that youth can watch to help with a baking demonstration and talk through some of the differences. Box will include the recipes, recording, some ingredients you may not typically have around your house, and a round cutter.

Chocolate Chip Cookies -

This is great for youth who are just getting started with baking or who would like to experiment a little bit and further their project learning. Beginners can learn how to read a recipe and learn basic measuring of ingredients. Those who would like to further their learning could experiment with trying out different oven temps, along with making some other changes such as using melted butter vs softened butter to see how it impacts their chocolate chip cookies!


Bread in a Bag & Sourdough Starter -

Youth will learn food science in a fun and yummy way with this easy recipe for making bread in a bag. Included in the box, youth will receive some of the ingredients they may typically have around their kitchen such as nonfat dry milk or quick-rising yeast. This is a great way for youth to start learning about baking yeast doughs!




